WORTHAM OAKS WELCOMES A SECOND-GENERATION

Holocaust Survivor

In recognition of Holocaust Remembrance Day on January 27, Wortham Oaks Elementary welcomed Varda Ratner, a second-generation Holocaust Survivor, to tell the story of her mom, Ilona Haendel.

Born in Budapest, Hungary, she endured Europe's harsh anti-Jewish discrimination. During the time of the Nazi's initial violence, she used her instinct and charm to save fellow Jews by passing out documents that would protect them under the auspices of the Swiss government.

She would eventually move to Palestine in 1947, where she would meet her future husband, Nathan, and witness the birth of Israel in 1948. She eventually immigrated to the United States in 1959 in Massachusetts, where Varda was born.

In 1991, she moved to San Antonio, Texas, where she worked as a teacher and spoke to area schools through the San Antonio Holocaust Memorial Museum's Educational Outreach Program. Her daughter, Varda, continues her legacy, telling her mother's story to schools around the city so students and adults alike can never forget about the events of the Holocaust.
